

Preparing for your visit to the Cancer Centre Plastic Surgery Clinic

Patient and Family Information Sheet

You have been referred to the Cancer Centre of Southeastern Ontario (the Cancer Centre) at Kingston General Hospital by your family doctor or another specialist. At the Cancer Centre you will see a plastic surgeon and may have a minor surgical procedure. This information sheet will help you prepare for your visit to the Cancer Centre.

If you take blood thinner medications, phone **613-544-3310** (toll free 1-855-544-3400) and dial the plastic surgeon's office extension circled below. They will tell you if you need to stop your blood thinner medication before your appointment.

Getting Here

The Cancer Centre is located at Kingston General Hospital (KGH) site in the Burr Wing of the hospital. The closest entrance to the Cancer Centre is the King Street entrance.

Parking

- Allow extra time for parking. You can also get dropped off at the King Street entrance while the person with you parks.
- Metered parking spaces are available in parking lots and on streets near the hospital. The closest parking to the Cancer Centre is on George Street or the Richardson Beach parking lot by Lake Ontario. The underground parking garage on Stuart Street is also available.

Your Visit

- Register for your appointment at the main reception desk located **on the ground floor of the Burr Wing (Burr 0)** at the **King Street entrance**.
- At this appointment you will meet a plastic surgeon and other members of the care team. The purpose of this visit is to get assessed by the plastic surgery team. You may also have a minor surgical procedure.
- Your appointment could last several hours. Try not to book other appointments on this day.

What to Bring

- A family member or friend for support and to drive you home afterwards if you have had a surgical procedure
- Your Health Card
- A list of all your medications and dosages, including over-the-counter medication, vitamins, minerals and herbal supplements
- Any medications you need to take during your visit, such as medications to manage diabetes
- Any test results or other information your referring doctor gave you to bring to your appointment
- Private health insurance information if applicable
- Items to keep you entertained and snacks
- Money for parking or to fill any possible prescriptions

Other Reminders

- If you speak a language other than English, use sign language, or are hearing impaired, we make our best effort to get a language interpreter for you. Please phone 613-549-6666 (toll free 1-800-567-5722) extension 4510 if you need an interpreter.
- KGH is a teaching hospital. During your visits, you will likely meet doctors, residents, nurses, students and other members of the care team.
