Patient and Family Information Sheet

You may need to travel for your cancer treatment. Affording the cost of travel or finding a place to stay can be an added stress during this time. This information sheet explains options that may be possible for you.

Transportation

The Canadian Cancer Society Wheels of Hope Patient Transportation Service

This is a service for patients who:

- Cannot afford the cost of travel, or
- Are not well enough to use public transportation, or
- Feel uncomfortable facing travel alone

Patients are picked up and taken to/from their appointments by a trained volunteer driver. There is an annual registration fee for this service. If you can't afford to pay, you may be eligible for help through their compassionate program.

Public Transit

Tax Deductions for Travel

If you have to travel at least 40 kilometers (one way) from your home to get medical services, you can claim vehicle and meal expenses on your yearly tax return.
